

Voting in New Hampshire

1. Are you eligible to vote?

- a. 18 or older
- b. U.S. citizen
- c. “Domiciled” in the town or city ward where you wish to vote
 - » Your domicile is your principal place of physical presence in NH

2. Do you have proof of eligibility?

- a. Government issued photo ID - driver’s license, passport
- b. Proof of domicile - NH driver’s license/non-driver ID, vehicle registration, government document, tax/benefit document, lease, utility bill, or other qualified proof
- c. U.S. birth certificate, U.S. passport/passport card, naturalization papers, or other acceptable proof

- d. You can establish citizenship by signing an affidavit but not identity, age, or domicile
- e. A student ID is no longer valid proof of eligibility

3. How do I register to vote?

- a. By visiting your city or town clerk’s office and completing a voter registration form in person
- b. By attending session held by local Supervisors of the Checklist
 - » By law they meet once, 6-13 days before an election
- c. You may also register to vote at the polls on election day
- d. Absentee registration via mail by checking appropriate box on absentee ballot application:

4. Where do I register:

- a. NH Find My Clerk: [Voter Information](#)

5. You can vote absentee if you are unable to vote in person for an authorized reason, including:

- a. Physical disability
- b. Religious observance
- c. Absence from city or town on the day of election
- d. Employment obligations, which include qualified care giving responsibilities:
 - » The Secretary of State maintains the authoritative list of qualifying reasons: [Voter Guide](#)



6. How do I vote absentee?

- a. Complete paper form in person at city or town clerk's office
 - » Complete Absentee Ballot request form
 - » If you are not registered to vote, check the second box in Section I ("I am absent from..."), which will trigger the office sending you registration papers;

- b. Mail/fax/hand deliver to clerk:
